Marine Corps History

FEBRUARY

National 4 Chaplains Day / 3 February / On 3 February 1943 the ship USAT Dorchester was torpedoed by German submarine U-223 off the coast of Newfoundland. 230 of 904 were rescued, most dying of hypothermia in the 34 degree waters. The four Chaplains on board gave their life jackets to others since there were not enough to go around, and helped everyone into the life boats. The four chaplains, each representing a different faith, went down with the ship. They were: George L. Fox, Alexander D. Goode, Clark V. Poling, and John P. Washington. 4 Chaplains Medal ➤



Iwo Jima 70th Anniversary / 19 February / As the Marines and Navy moved up through the Pacific toward Japan, many island battles were fought with well dug in and heavily fortified Japanese forces. These battle conditions resulted in heavy casualties for the Marines. The assault on Iwo Jima (DETACHMENT) took place on 19 February 1945 by the 4th and 5th Marine Divisions. The 3rd Marine Division was held in reserve and later called into action as casualties mounted. Some 2,300 casualties occurred during the initial landing. The island was declared secure on 16 March, although cleaning up enemy resistance continued a bit longer. The entire 21,000 man Japanese force was KIA, while the Marines had 26,000 casualties (almost 6,000 KIA), the Navy had 2,798 casualties, and the Army support units had 37 casualties. Viet Nam 50th Anniversary / 8 March / After some ten years of U.S. military advisor support, the first combat troops landed in Viet Nam on 8 March 1965 when Marines of the 9th Marine Expeditionary Brigade (MEB, later renamed the III Marine Amphibious Force) landed at Da Nang to secure the airfield base. The Marine force in I Corps grew to a full reinforced Division / Wing Marine Amphibious Force of 25,000 during the summer of 1965. SE Asia Conflict statistics: KIA 13,073 & WIA 88,633.
