Marine Corps History

APRIL

Viet Nam 50th Anniversary / 8 March / After some ten years of U.S. military advisor support, the first combat troops landed in Viet Nam on 8 March 1965 when Marines of the 9th Marine Expeditionary Brigade (MEB, later renamed the III Marine Amphibious Force) landed at Da Nang to secure the airfield base. The Marine force in I Corps grew to a full reinforced Division / Wing Marine Amphibious Force of 25,000 during the summer of 1965. SE Asia Conflict statistics: KIA 13,073 & WIA 88,633. 27 April 1805 First Lieutenant Presley O'Bannon, along with seven other Marines, together with a force led by American Consul William Eaton raised the U.S. flag over a the conquered fortress of Tripolitan pirates.

12-13 April 1918 Marines suffered first gas attack from mustard gas bombard- ment near Ver- dun. Nine officers and 305 enlisted Marines were evacuated and 30 died from the effects of the gas.

3 April 1945 Marines on Okinawa made good progress clearing Zampa Misaki and seizing the Katchin Peninsula, cutting the island in two.

21 April 1951 Marine carrier based planes made their first aerial contact with enemy planes over the Korean front lines.

15 April 1962 Marine operational involvement in the Vietnam War began on Palm Sunday when HMM-362 Sikorsky UH-34s arrived at Soc Trang in the Delta south of Saigon.

18 April 1983 One Marine security guard was killed and seven wounded whan a car bomb ex-ploded outside the U.S. Embassy in Beirut, Lebanon. The explosion killed 61 people, including 17 Americans.


