History & General Information

Marine Corps History - JANUARY

25 January 1856 / Marines and seamen from the U.S. sloop DECATUR went ashore at the village of Seattle, Washington to protect settlers from Indian raids.

21 January 1918 / The 1st Aeronautical Company arrived at Ponta Delgada, Azores, for anti submarine duty—one of the first completely equipped American aviation units to serve overseas in World War I.

18 January 1951 / 1st Marine Division began mopping-up operations against guerrillas in the Pohang area, South Korea.

20 January 1968 / The second battle for Khe Sanh began when Marines from 3rd Battalion, 26th Marines attacked a North Vietnamese battalion between Hill 881 and Hill 881 North.

16 January 1991 / Operation Desert Shield became Operation Desert Storm as forces of the allied coalition launched an air campaign against targets in Iraq and occupied Kuwait in an effort to liberate Kuwait.

29 January 1991 / First serious ground fighting of Operation Desert Storm broke out when Iraqi troops mounted an attack into Saudi Arabia. Saudi and Quatari troops, supported by artillery from the 1st Marine Division and attack helicopters and other allied coalition aircraft, re-captured Khafji two days later.

SPRING CONFERENCE is April 22-29, 2017 at Safety Harbor FL. See web-site for details.

The INJURED WARRIORS FUND OF FLORIDA has now disbursed over **\$83,000** to 83 needy combat injured warriors.

The SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM this year has now awarded **\$500** each to over 42 recipients (2016-17).

The LEADERSHIP PROGRAM at the 2017 Spring Conference is expecting **60** participants. Training will be held on Thursday and Friday.

The BOY SCOUTS (EAGLE) PROGRAM awarded **40** more Good Citizenship Awards (Oct-Dec 2016).

Department of Florida membership stands at over **3,700** with an additional 630 delinquent members. A major effort will be made this year to reduce this number. **Our Gator Detachment has already made significant progress - we now have no delinquent members.** Also, the Department of Florida was awarded the **Tom Perrone Award** for having the most new members.

Discounts are now available to veterans on Florida public park entrance fees. Also, publicly operated airports are now prohibited from charging parking fees to vehicles with disabled veteran license plates.

NATIONAL MID-WINTER CONVENTION 2017 will take place at Fredericksburg VA on March 2-4. See the national website for information.

VA has announced there were 39,471 homeless veterans in 2016, a decrease of 47% since 2010. Of these, 13,000 were unsheltered, a decrease of 56% since 2010. Florida had 2,902 homeless veterans in 2016, a decrease of 26.1% since 2015.

MCL has instituted a new **Honorary Active Duty membership category**. Active Duty Marines, FMF Corpsman, and FMF Chaplains can now become Honorary Active Duty members (free) of the MCL for the duration of their enlistment. They will have all rights and privileges of a regular member, except for voting or holding elective office.
