History & General Information

Marine Corps History - MAY

MEXICAN WAR 1846-1848 / Although fighting started in April, at the request of President James Polk a U.S. declaration of war against Mexico was passed on MAY 13, 1846. This two year war resulted in the annexation of lands now known as Arizona, California, Colorado, Nevada, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Utah (Texas was annexed in 1845 and this is one of the reasons fighting broke out). Still serving its traditional roles with the Navy, the Marines did not have a significant role; however, they did participate in several landings along side the Navy and Army. A major battle for the Marines was the Battle of Chapultepec in September 1847, which resulted in "the Halls of Montezuma" lyrics in the Marines' Hymn.

WORLD WAR I JUNE 1917 / Having declared war in April and with an increase in strength approved, the month of MAY 1917 saw a significant Marine Corps recruitment effort. There was no need to reduce its recruitment standards as there were more volunteers than were needed. Throughout the war only 60,189 volunteers were accepted out of the 239, 274 who tried to enlist in the Marine Corps.

Recruitment training took place at newly established depots. In use since 1891, MARINE CORPS RECRUIT DEPOT PARRIS ISLAND was officially established in 1915. MARINE BARRACKS QUANTICO (now MARINE CORPS BASE QUANTICO) was established in 1917. MARINE CORPS RECRUIT DEPOT SAN DIEGO was established in 1919.



MCL Department of Florida Information

The INJURED WARRIORS FUND OF FLORIDA has now disbursed over **\$83,000** to 83 needy combat injured warriors.

The SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM this year has now awarded \$500 each to over 42 recipients (2016-17).

The LEADERSHIP PROGRAM at the 2017 Spring Conference is expecting **60** participants. Training will be held on Thursday and Friday.

The BOY SCOUTS (EAGLE) PROGRAM awarded **40** more Good Citizenship Awards (Oct-Dec 2016).

Department of Florida membership stands at over **3,700** with an additional 630 delinquent members. A major effort will be made this year to reduce this number. **Our Gator Detachment has already made significant progess - we now have no delinquent members**. Also, the Department of Florida was awarded the **Tom Perrone Award** for having the most new members.

Discounts are now available to veterans on Florida public park entrance fees. Also, publicly operated airports are now prohibited from charging parking fees to vehicles with disabled veteran license plates.

MCL National Information

VA has announced there were 39,471 homeless veterans in 2016, a decrease of 47% since 2010. Of these, 13,000 were unsheltered, a decrease of 56% since 2010. Florida had 2,902 homeless veterans in 2016, a decrease of 26.1% since 2015.

MCL has instituted a new **Honorary Active Duty membership category**. Active Duty Marines, FMF Corpsman, and FMF Chaplins can now become Honorary Active Duty members (free) of the MCL for the duration of their enlistment. They will have all rights and privileges of a regular member, except for voting or holding elective office.

Ardie R. Copas State Veterans Nursing Home in St. Lucie County has been funded and work should begin this Fall on the 120 bed facility. Construction should be completed in 18-22 months.
