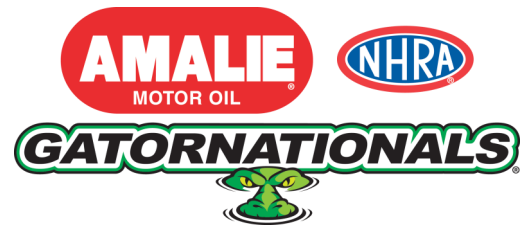
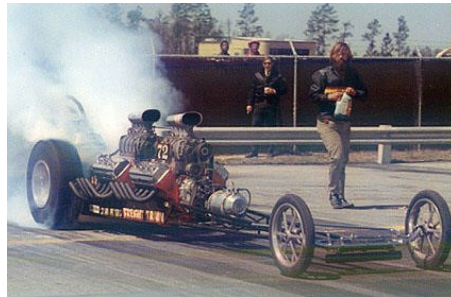

History & General Information

Marine Corps History - FEBRUARY



11 February 1922 / BGen John Russell (future Commandant) was appointed U.S. High Commissioner and personal representative of the President to the government of Haiti. This placed him in supreme command of the occupying American force and the Haitian Gendarmerie.

2 February 1944 / The 4th Marine Division, as part of the first assault on islands controlled by the Japanese before the start of World War II, captured Namur and eight other islands in the Kwajalein Atoll.

6 February 1968 / The 1st Battalion, 1st Marines and 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines recaptured Hue's hospital, jail and provincial headquarters. It would take three more weeks of intense house to house fighting, with nearly a thousand Marines killed and wounded, before the imperial city was secured.

19 February 1945 / The assault on Iwo Jima (DETACHMENT) took place on 19 February 1945 by the 4th and 5th Marine Divisions. The 3rd Marine Division was held in reserve and later called into action as casualties mounted. Some 2,300 casualties occurred during the initial landing. The island was declared secure on 16 March, although cleaning up enemy resistance continued a bit longer.

28 February 1991 / Operation Desert Storm ended when the cease-fire declared by President George Bush went into effect.

The INJURED WARRIORS FUND OF FLORIDA has disbursed over \$57,000 to needy combat injured warriors.

The SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM this year has awarded \$350 each to over 40 recipients.

The LEADERSHIP PROGRAM at the 2015 Fall Conference had nearly 60 participants.

The BOY SCOUTS (EAGLE) PROGRAM will award 70 Good Citizenship Awards in January 2016.

Department of Florida membership stands at 3,652 with an additional 711 delinquent members. A major effort will be made this year to reduce this number. Our Gator Detachment has already made significant progress in this direction.
