History & General Information

Marine Corps History - OCTOBER



5 October 1775 Word “Marines” used on one of the earliest known occasions at a meeting in Philadelphia during second Continental Congress. General George Washington gave orders for the “proper encouragement to the Marines and seamen” for their service on U.S. armed ships.

31 October 1919 Marines and Gendarmes took over the headquarters of the Haitian bandit chief Charlemagne Peralte, killing him and dispersing his followers. Sergeant Hanneken and Cor-poral William William Button were awarded the Medal of Honor.

6 October 1945 Major General Keller Rockey accepted the surrender of 50,000 Japanese troops in North China on behalf of the Chinese Nationalist government.

11 October 1951 A Marine Battalion was flown to a frontline combat position for the first time during Operation Bumblebee, northeast of Yanggu, Korea.

28 October 1962 One week after the Marine Corps was put on alert, the 5th Marine Expeditionary Brigade left Camp Pendleton for the Caribbean during the Cuban Missile Crisis. Also, the 1st and 2nd Marine Divisions were sent to Guantanamo Bay to reinforce those already there. Other units were deployed to Key West, Florida.

23 October 1983 The BLT headquarters building was destroyed in Beirut, Lebanon killing 220 Marines as well as others.

The INJURED WARRIORS FUND OF FLORIDA has now disbursed over **\$65,000** to needy combat injured warriors.

The SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM this year has now awarded **\$450** each to over 40 recipients.

The LEADERSHIP PROGRAM at the 2015 Fall Conference had nearly **40** participants.

The BOY SCOUTS (EAGLE) PROGRAM will award **156** Good Citizenship

Department of Florida membership stands at over **3,700** with an additional 630 delinquent members. A major effort will be made this year to reduce this number. **Our Gator Detachment has already made significant progress - we now have no delinquent members.** Also, the Department of Florida was awarded the **Tom Perrone Award** for having the most new members.

Discounts are now available to veterans on Florida public park entrance fees. Also, publicly operated airports are now prohibited from charging parking fees to vehicles with disabled veteran license plates.

ANNUAL NATIONAL CONVENTION 2017 will take place at Overland Park KS on 13-18 August. See the national website for information.

SE DIVISION CONFERENCE 2017 will take place at Mobile AL on 30 March—1 April. See website for information.

VA Airborne Hazards and Open Burn Pit Registry is now open to veterans who served after August 1990 in Operation Desert Shield, Operation Desert Storm, Operation Enduring Freedom, Operation Iraqi Freedom, Operation New Dawn, Djibouti, or Africa. (For respiratory and related health conditions.)

VA has announced \$3.4 Million in funding to help homeless veterans. As a result number of homeless vets has been cut almost in half. Two states and 29 communities have claimed to have ended homeless veterans in their areas.

MCL has instituted a new **Honorary Active Duty membership category**. Active Duty Marines, FMF Corpsman, and FMF Chaplains can now become Honorary Active Duty members (free) of the MCL for the duration of their enlistment. They will have all rights and privileges of a regular member, except for voting or holding elective office.
